Henry's holiday


Henry likes holidays at home. He likes looking for lizards and flying his kite in the field behind his house. He likes playing badminton

'And it's fun and exciting to eat and sleep in a tent!' his mother said.


The campsite was near a beach.


'Please snow too!' Henry thought. 'I want to go home!'

now.




Cocketta Bird picked up the scarf and flew back home with it.





'But I always listen to the radio first ...' his grandmother started to say. But then she stopped. 'All right! Good idea! Where's my coat?'



One summer morning, Tom woke up and walked to his window. The river looked silver in the sun and the trees danced in the wind.




'Hmm,' Tom thought. 'Today is a good day to be in the forest.'




'I must give this fruit a name,' he thought. 'I know. It's a tomango!'







'And the school gates are closed because it's Saturday — the first day of our school holidays!' Angela shouted happily.






'No,' Fred said. 'Octopuses have got eight arms. Did you know that, Aunt Jane? They've got three hearts too!'




'Great!' thought Daisy. 'Parties are always exciting, but a fancy-dress party is very exciting!' She went to tell her mother about the invitation.




