### The history of doctors



**Example**

- 1 About 1,000 years ago there was no medicine  
 and doctors usually helped people who were  
 ill by giving them drinks made from plants or fruits. These  
 'doctors' were not like our doctors today. They learnt their  
 2 job from friends and older people who learned  
 about the different plants.
- 3 Later doctors started to study the body and to write  
 books and pictures of parts of the body  
 to help them understand better how the body worked.  
 4 There were pictures of arms, legs, hands and  
 5 feet. There were also pictures of the inside  
 of the head and stomach. Many of these pictures were  
 6 drawn beautiful but not always correct, because  
 the doctors could only draw their idea of the inside of the
